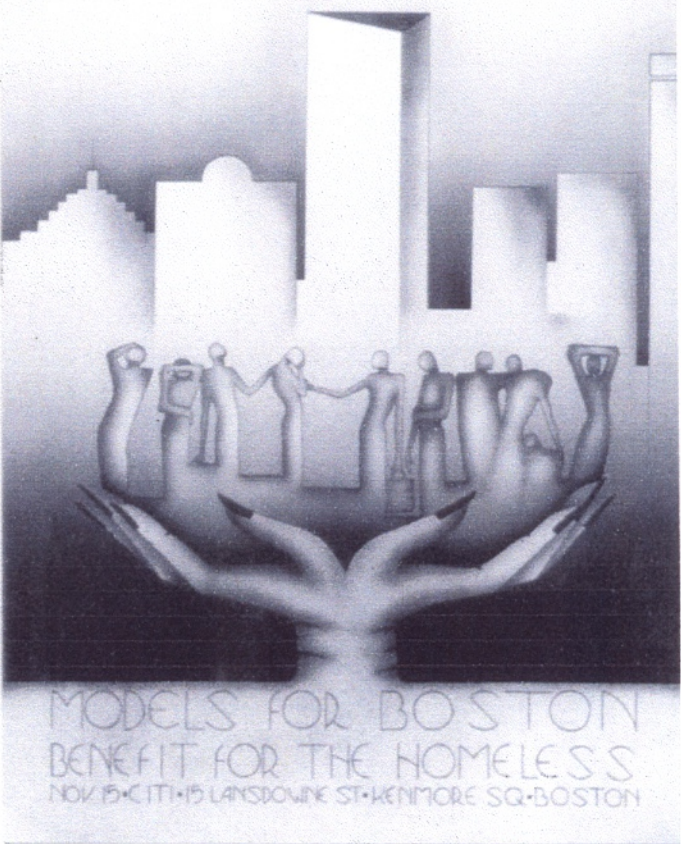


1989 ABSOLUT
